

Love your pavements and don't get fined

Summer's calling and end of term parties will be kicking in! If you're moving out, spare a thought for how you will get rid of any big items of waste, like mattresses and furniture – or even your old files and coursework. Just leaving it in the garden or pavement to be taken away costs money and makes the road look bad for your neighbours.

Love your pavements by following these simple tips:

- Make sure you leave your front garden clear of rubbish.
- If you've arranged to have rubbish collected you can leave it at the front of your property, but don't leave it on the pavement
- Speak to your Landlord or Letting Agent – they may arrange to have things taken away

You can get an on the spot fine if you dump waste and enforcement staff will be patrolling the areas where you live.

What can you do?

- Use your green lidded bin to dispose of all general household waste
- Use your blue lidded bin to recycle all cardboard, paper, cans and plastic bottles
- If you expect to have a lot of paper such as coursework to dispose of, please put it in the blue lidded bin. If you cannot fit it in the bin, ask for your free recycling sack. These will be available from both universities during May and June
- Contact the council's Actionline on 0800 5 19 19 19 if you need to dispose of Bulky Household Waste such as furniture and mattresses or have any waste/recycling queries. The cost is only £25 for up to 10 items of bulky household waste.
- Alternatively, you can take these items free of charge to the 'Rubbish Revived' site at Endle Street, between the football stadium and Ocean Village
- Contact local charity SCRATCH on 023 8077 3132. They charge £5 to collect donated furniture. Their requirements vary from time to time.
