### Dates and fees:

The below are the dates and fees for 2016/17. **All students are expected to attend until 3 September 2016** in order to qualify for University of Southampton's English Language requirement.

Tuition Fees include a GBP 500 non-refundable pre-payment fee may be required. This will be payable after you have applied for a course.

### Entry Levels:

Academic Year 2016/17
<b>Semester 1, 2 and 3</b>
29 September 2016 - 8 September 2017
The EAS course can accept applicants starting on 29 September 2016 with a level equivalent to <b>IELTS 4.5, with a minimum score of 4.5 or higher in each component.</b>
<b>Semester 2 and 3</b>
30 January 2017 - 8 September 2017
An entry level of at least <b>IELTS 5.0, with a minimum score of 5.0 or higher in each component.</b>
<b>Note:</b> Applicants who meet the normal entry requirements above are expected to study until 8 September 2017. For advice on which course to apply for please contact the English Language Admissions Team.

### **Assessment:**

Monitoring your progress while you are with us is important and you will be assessed regularly throughout the course:

- You will be assessed on work each semester through continuous assessment, and a final exam at the end of each semester.
- The assessment will cover all four skills: reading and writing, listening and speaking.
- It will include the necessary study skills to equip you for your future university studies.
- In Semester 2 you will decide on a topic for a Personal Research Project (PRP).
- At the end of the course you will be given a final grade.
- Students who achieve an **appropriate** overall final grade on the course will be considered to have met the English Language entry requirements of the University of Southampton.
