See where our academics work at the forefront of their fields, creating cutting-edge solutions to some of the world's biggest problems.

## Hartley Library

## Hands-on Particle Physics

An exciting, live-action lecture all about particle physics. Through a series of hands-on demonstrations, you'll learn how to drive different types of particle accelerators, from the thousands of small machines which are used in medicine and industry, to the 27 km ring of the Large Hadron Collider in Switzerland.

## Health Sciences Skills and Lab Tour

See our state-of-the-art skills laboratories and hear how we enable students to run a range of clinical interventions and procedures through simulated practice. These exercises utilise a range of clinical equipment, actors and computer controlled mannequins which talk, breathe, have pulses, heart and chest sounds and allow students to review their performance alongside their lecturer.

## High Voltage Laboratory

The Tony Davies Voltage Laboratory is a unique facility which has put the University at the forefront of innovative research in power supply conduction and distribution. See a demonstration of high voltage phenomena, including arcs, discharges, plasma generation and high voltage breakdown.

## Language taster sessions

Ever thought about learning a language? Get involved in a lecture and some taster sessions to introduce you to the verbal worlds of Arabic, Farsi, Japanese and Chinese.

## Psychology

We will be running an exhibition where you can pop in during the day and take a trip down memory lane but also get a feel for what our department has become.
