Professor Bernard Harris

Bernard Harris is Professor of the History of Social Policy in the School of Social Sciences at the University of Southampton. He has a wide range of interests relating to the history of health and welfare, and social policy. In addition to his work on the origins of the British welfare state, he has also worked on the history of school medical provision in Britain and published a number of articles on the history of height, health, morbidity and mortality. He has recently completed a co-authored study, entitled *The changing body: health, nutrition and human development in the western world since 1700*, for publication by Cambridge University Press in 2011. He has also been engaged in research into the history of morbidity, using friendly-society records, as part of a joint project with Andrew Hinde (Social Statistics), Aravinda Guntupalli (School of Medicine) and Martin Gorsky (London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine).
