Entry Levels:

Academic Year 2015/16

Semester 1, 2 and 3

24 September 2015 - 3 September 2016

The EAS course can accept applicants starting on 24 September 2015 with a level equivalent to IELTS 4.5, with a minimum score of 4.5 or higher in each component.

Semester 2 and 3

25 January 2016 - 3 September 2016

An entry level of at least IELTS 5.0, with a minimum score of 5.0 or higher in each component.

Note: Applicants who meet the normal entry requirements above are expected to study until 3 September 2016. For advice on which course to apply for please contact the English Language Admissions Team.

- It will include the necessary study skills to equip you for your future university studies.
- In Semester 2 you will decide on a topic for a Personal Research Project (PRP).
- At the end of the course you will be given a final grade.
- Students who achieve an appropriate overall final grade on the course will be considered
 to have met the English Language entry requirements of the University of Southampton.
