## Highfield Campus route to Avenue Campus

Postcode: SO17 1BF

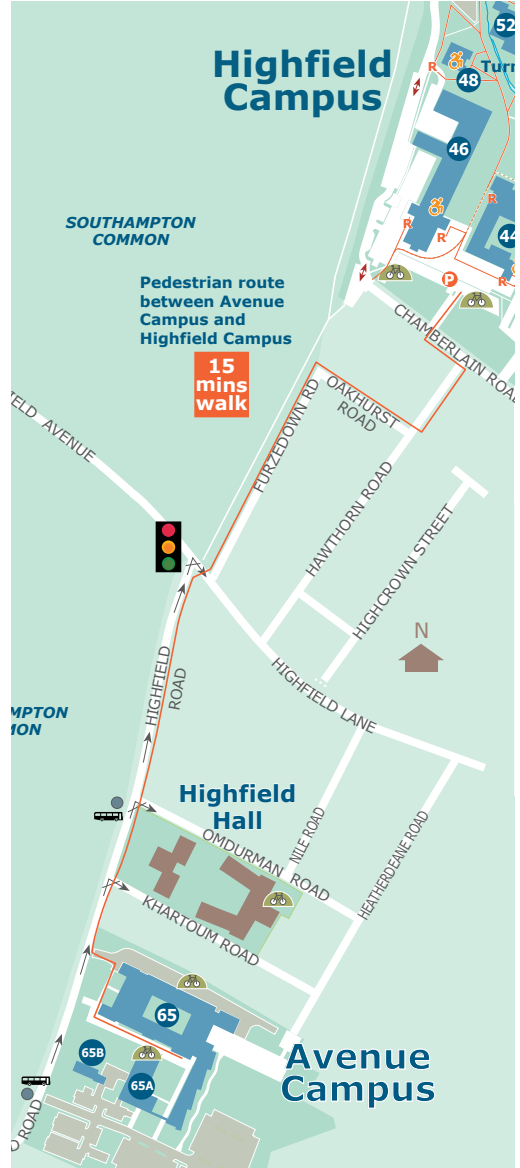
Our humanities campus is located on the edge of Southampton Common, and is a short walk from Highfield. It's likely this will become one of your favourite walks if you are to be a humanities student here. Avenue Campus can be accessed by bus too, so if the weather isn't looking favourable head to the Highfield Interchange and speak to one of our student ambassadors to find out which bus to catch.

## Travel to the National Oceanography Centre Southampton (NOCS)

Postcode: SO14 3ZH

Our waterfront campus is home to our Oceanography, Geology, Geophysics and Marine Biology courses. If you are travelling by bus, catch the U1C bus from the Highfield Interchange or from outside the Student Services Centre – the bus journey will take around 40 minutes.

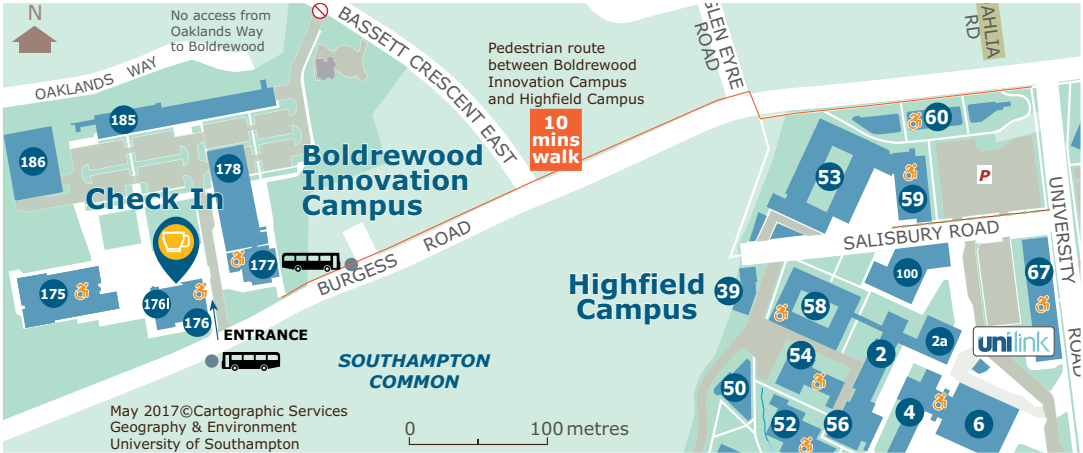
Driving time can vary depending on time and day, but we'd recommend at least 40 minutes for the journey from Highfield to NOCS. Remember to have your programme or confirmation email with you, as you'll need this to get into Dock Gate 4.





### Boldrewood Innovation Campus route to Highfield Campus

Our new Boldrewood Innovation Campus houses our centre for innovation, business and education in maritime engineering and engineering sciences. It's only a short stroll but can be accessed by bus too. Speak to our student ambassadors at the Highfield Interchange for information on which bus to catch.
