Creating Your LinkedIn Profile

Once you've registered with LinkedIn you will need to create your profile. Here's how!

Photo – Upload a professional photo. This can be taken on a mobile phone, just dress smart and smile.

Banner – Including a banner can serve as an extra means of self-promotion.

Pronunciation – If your name is commonly mispronounced, you can add a voice recording of the pronunciation using the LinkedIn mobile app.

Headline – Write a concise headline that is professional but memorable. Think about your current position, what you want to do in the future, and how you are different. If you are looking for work, consider stating this, along with the role you are seeking.

Contact Information – Include contact details so others can contact you.

About – Include a summary that describes your current situation, qualifications, work experiences, and any relevant activities. Focus on accomplishments, why you do what you do, how you can help others, and what you want to do in the future. Aim for at least 40 but no more than 350 words. Be concise and include plenty of keywords. Research what keywords prospects use when searching online for your desired job/service/ solution and include these in your summary but do still try to find unique ways to describe yourself. Finish with the action you want others to take.

Featured – You can add multimedia to your profile. For example, you can upload documents or presentations, links to websites, or pin LinkedIn posts or articles that you have written.

Experience – Detail your work experiences and include thorough descriptions. Highlight your accomplishments and the employability skills acquired. If you have lots of work experiences, it is OK to only include the most relevant ones. You can also upload examples of your work or links to webpages.

Then reorder them so your top 3 are pinned at the top. Ask your contacts to endorse you as this builds credibility and endorse others too. Regularly update this section.

Accomplishments – You can add a range of accomplishments in this section. For example, publications, patents, honours and awards, languages, and projects.

Recommendations – Ask professors, managers, and classmates who you have worked with to write a recommendation for you. This adds credibility to your skills and will add strength to your profile.
