## Using the physical libraries

**Studying in the Libraries**: <u>Prebook</u> a study space at Hartley, the Health Services Library and Winchester School of Art Library. Study spaces are two metres apart and cleaning materials will be provided. The computer workstation rooms within the libraries remain closed, but some bookable PCs will be available. The Avenue Library & Learning Commons and National Oceanographic Library remain closed.

**Browse & Borrow**: <u>Prebook</u> a timeslot to select books from the shelves at Hartley or the Health Services Library, then use the self-issue machine. Please note that Browse & Borrow is not currently available at Winchester School of Art Library.

**Click & Collect**: We are continuing to offer our Click & Collect service. To reserve the books you want, use the Place Hold option in <u>WebCat</u>, our library catalogue. We will notify you when they are available for you to collect any time the libraries are open.

**Book returns**: You can return books to the Hartley book returns letterbox or the red box outside the Health Services Library and Winchester School of Art Library entrances. It may take a few days before the books are removed from your library account. All books will be quarantined to ensure they are safe to borrow.

If you need a book, chapter, journal article or other item that we do not hold in the library collections, use our <u>interlibrary loan</u> service. Note this service is not fully operational, but you should still make a request You can often find legal open access copies of journal articles using tools such as <u>Unpaywall and Open Access Button</u>.
