Our history

You may already know that the University of Southampton received its Royal Charter on 29 April 1952, in the early weeks of the reign of HM Queen Elizabeth II. In fact, our roots go back much further than this – to 1862. This is when the Hartley Institution was established in the city centre, following a bequest by Henry Robinson Hartley, the son of a local wine merchant, to the Corporation of Southampton. Located in Below Bar, the Hartley Institution was opened by the then Prime Minister, Lord Palmerston.

In 1902 it was renamed Hartley College, before becoming Hartley University College and, later, University College, Southampton. The Hartley name is still remembered in the Hartley Library that we all know and love.

Today's university

This year marks a very auspicious anniversary for our University. Exactly 70 years ago, we were honoured to be the first university to be granted a Royal Charter by HM Queen Elizabeth II, two months after her accession to the throne.

The Royal Charter enabled Southampton for the first time to award its own degrees as a fully independent university, after many years as a degree-awarding branch of the University of London.

We've come a long way in 70 years; from a student cohort of around 850 undergraduate and postgraduate students, we now have over 24,500 studying across our campuses in Southampton, Winchester and Malaysia. We welcome and support bright and motivated students from over 135 countries to be the best they can be, pioneer flexible learning and encourage interdisciplinary practice across our academic community.

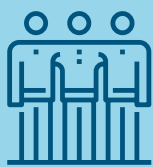

Professor Mark E. Smith CBE

President and Vice-Chancellor

As President and Vice-Chancellor, Mark is the Chief Executive of the University and has overall responsibility for its operations. He took up this role on 1 October 2019.

Mark was Vice-Chancellor at Lancaster University from 2012 until September 2019. He was previously Deputy Vice-Chancellor of the University of Warwick.

Throughout his academic career, he has published more than 380 papers about advanced magnetic resonance techniques, helping to understand a range of problems in the field of materials physics.

Mark holds several external appointments including Senior Independent Member of UKRI EPSRC's Council; and board member of the Higher Education Funding Council for Wales, chairing their Research Wales Committee.

He was awarded a CBE for Services to Research and Higher Education in the 2019 Queen's Birthday Honours.

Senior Vice-President (Academic)

As Senior Vice-President (Academic), Phil plays a vital role in promoting and maintaining the University's academic mission and acts as standing deputy for the Vice-Chancellor. He chairs the Deans' Council and has oversight of all academic planning across faculties, ensuring the alignment of resources with the University's strategic goals.

Providing a key focus on ensuring a 'One Southampton' approach to a range of strategic activities including championing the development of an Estates Strategic Plan for the University, Phil also provides academic leadership on people-related issues, enables closer engagement on major academic initiatives and champions the University's portfolio of multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary activity.

Phil joined Southampton in May 2021, from Newcastle University where he was Pro Vice-Chancellor for the Faculty of Science, Agriculture and Engineering. He also had executive board responsibility for digital activities and chaired the Digital Campus Strategy Group.

Deborah is a Professor of Medical Education who joined us as Vice-President (Education and Student Experience) in April 2022 from University College London (UCL) where her former roles included Interim Vice Provost (Education and Student Experience), Pro-Vice Provost for Student Experience and Head of the Medical School.

Qualifying in Medicine in 1990, Deborah has combined her academic career with her role as a General Practitioner and was awarded a Chair of Medical Education in 2015 in recognition of her innovative work in transforming undergraduate medical education and her research in transitions and work-based learning.

As Vice President (Education and Student Experience) she plays a central role in ensuring an excellent learning experience and outcomes for all our students and keeping students at the heart of decision-making.

Mark is a Professor of Engineering Materials, whose research and educational interests focus on materials, solid mechanics, composite materials and micro-electromechanical systems. He leads on the University's Research, Knowledge Exchange and Enterprise Strategies.

He is a Trustee of the Faraday Institution and Chair of the Fellowship Evaluation Panel for the Singapore National Research Foundation, and was awarded Singapore's Public Service Medal (Friend of Singapore) in 2021. He is a member of the Engineering and Physical Sciences Research Council's Capital Equipment Strategic Advisory Team and the UKRI Infrastructure Advisory Committee. He is a Fellow of the Royal Aeronautical Society and Associate Fellow of the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics.

Prior to joining Southampton, Mark spent 10 years as a Professor of Aeronautics and Astronautics at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and has also worked in industry and has served in the British Army.

Your graduation ceremony is all about you! It is your chance to celebrate your amazing achievements with your peers, University staff, friends and family.

It is the moment that your years of study and dedication to your subject have been leading up to; a moment that, we hope, you will cherish and look back on fondly for the rest of your life.

Ceremony schedule

- The congregation is asked to stand as the procession enter the venue and to remain standing until the Presiding Officer and members of the procession have taken their seats.
- The Presiding Officer will declare graduation open and address the congregation.
- The reader will read the degree classifications to be awarded and graduands will process across the stage when their name is being read and receive a handshake or a similar formal gesture) from the Presiding Officer.
- The Dean of Faculty or their nominated officer will address the congregation.
- If there is an award for a higher doctorate, these will be presented next.
- The Presiding Officer will address the congregation and declare graduation closed.
- The congregation is requested to stand for the procession and remain in their seats until the entire procession has left the stage.

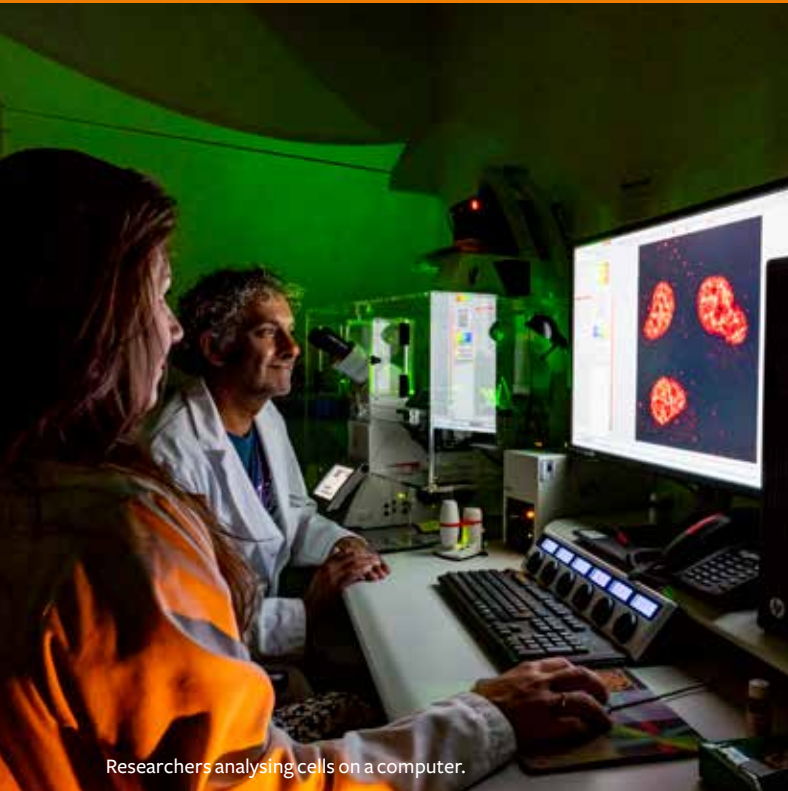

PROTECTING COMMUNITIES AGAINST VIRUSES

An education programme developed by LifeLab at the University, designed to help primary school children protect themselves from the spread of COVID-19, is now available to young people across the UK.

Children and young people make up a third of the UK population. Their health and wellbeing are top priorities for the UK government, and our scientific evidence shows that a healthy lifestyle at an early age is important for long-term health.

LifeLab is a unique initiative where young people take part in fun and engaging sessions, conduct experiments, meet scientists, and learn first-hand why and how to lead healthier lives.

The COVID-19 Warrior's programme is an education package that teaches primary school children about the virus, introducing characters who each have superpowers that can limit its spread. Pupils are encouraged to adopt these superpower skills and become COVID Warriors in their own communities.

Dr Kath Woods-Townsend, LifeLab Programme Lead, says: "The COVID-19 Warrior package gives young people the information they need to make the right choices about keeping safe. We are delighted that the Royal Society for Public Health is now supporting the programme and are pleased more schools across the country have access to it."

Work is now underway to transform the COVID-19 Warrior package into a more widely applicable resource called Health Warriors, which will further support the wider work of LifeLab in engaging children and young people, with the science behind the health messages.

SUPERCHARGING YOUR IMMUNE SYSTEM

Researchers from Southampton have found a potential new treatment that could boost the power of the human immune system, helping it to find and destroy cancer cells within the body.

"A patient's immune system is more than able to detect and remove cancer cells, and immunotherapy pioneered at Southampton has recently emerged as a novel therapy for many different types of cancers," says Nullin Divecha, Professor of Cellular Signalling in Biological Sciences.

"However, cancer cells can generate a microenvironment within the tumour that stops the immune system from working, thereby limiting the general use and success of immunotherapy."

Nullin and his laboratory team have identified a way to stop this microenvironment from occurring by restricting the activity of a group of enzymes in cells called PIP4K that regulate the immune system. This in turn unleashes other immune cells to attack tumours in cancer patients.

PROTECTING AGAINST RISING SEA LEVELS

Climate change and rising sea levels are putting the world's storm surge barriers under increasing pressure. Research by oceanographers at Southampton aims to understand the impact this change in climate is having on these barriers that protect approximately 30 million people and trillions of pounds of property and infrastructure globally.

Dr Ivan Haigh, Associate Professor in Coastal Oceanography, PhD student Sunke Trace-Kleeberg and colleagues, in collaboration with Rijkswaterstaat – the Dutch Ministry of Infrastructure and Water Management – are looking at the Netherlands' six storm surge barriers. The goal is to understand the potential impact of climate change on these barriers and to plan a programme of maintenance to ensure they are fit for the future.

“Accelerating rates of sea level rise and changes in the frequency and intensity of storms are starting to cause surge barriers to have to close more frequently. This has critical implications for barrier operation, integrity, reliability, maintenance, projected lifespan and future upgrade or replacement planning,” says Ivan.

“Our expertise on storms surges, sea level rise and climate change is crucial to understand what needs to be done to ensure that these protective barriers continue to operate in future years.”

LOOKING AFTER THE SANDWICH GENERATION

Research from the University is informing policy on how society can support the so-called ‘sandwich generation’.

The sandwich generation are those who support both older and younger generations. As our population ages, it is increasingly common for adults in mid-life to be supporting older children and grandchildren, while also providing informal care for older family and friends.

The research, led by Athina Vlachantoni, Professor of Gerontology and Social Policy, Professor Maria Evandrou, Director of the Centre for Research on Ageing and Professor Jane Falkingham, Director of the Centre for Population Change and Connecting Generations, has found that the sandwich generation faces emotional and financial pressures, and diminishing social interactions.

“Our early findings indicate that around one third of those in mid-life are ‘at risk’ of having to provide care to multiple generations of their families, and about half have to provide some care to both grandchildren and elderly parents at the same time,” says Athina.

“Figuring out ways to support individuals who care for multiple generations needs to be a policy priority. For example, facilitating ways for mid-life people to respond to family support demands while maintaining paid employment, will be critical in fostering future intergenerational support.”

DESIGNING ELECTRIC VEHICLES

A team of Southampton students has designed its first-ever electric vehicle mirroring changes in the car industry, aiming for sustainable energy sources.

The students are part of Formula Student a student-run organisation focused on motorsport. Students work together using their technical expertise to design, build and race single-seater cars across a series of events akin to Formula One.

Ryan McDermott, a fourth-year aeronautics and astronautics student, who leads Southampton University Formula Student Team (SUFST) says: “At Southampton, we have access to a wealth of machines and manufacturing centres. So, I’ve spent hours in labs making parts for the car, which is a skill I wouldn’t get anywhere else.”

“I was always interested in joining Formula Student because I’d always been interested in motorsport, so it made sense to get involved.” He added: “Every Formula One team has a Southampton graduate, so the University is viewed very positively by F1 teams.”

OPTIMISING SPORTS PERFORMANCE

Dr Devon Lewis, a PhD researcher in Neuroscience at Southampton, has launched his own business, Inpulse, to give sports teams the ability to monitor muscle fatigue during training sessions so undertrained muscles can be improved and overtrained muscles can be flagged before they lead to injuries.

“Injuries can end athletes’ careers in an instant. Sports teams need the ability to monitor the health and performance of their players muscles during every training session so they can identify issues before injuries occur.” Devon explains.

“We developed the world’s first wearable sensor that directly monitors muscle fatigue and we’re working with seven Premier League Football Teams to get their players back to peak performance faster without risking further injuries.”

Inpulse was runner-up in the start-up category of the UK national Engineers in Business Competition (EIBC) Award and is currently based at the University’s on campus accelerator Future Worlds.

UNDERSTANDING OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH MONEY

A research project led by Southampton is revealing how finance has been imagined and represented by art and other forms of visual culture over the last three centuries.

Through a series of exhibitions and events across the UK, the research explored our cultural imagination and understanding of what money really is and how money really functions.

Professor Nicky Marsh, Principal Investigator at Southampton has also led a project on The History of Financial Advice, explaining for the first time how people are trained to understand and enter the financial marketplace.

This research has also looked at the way in which store cards and credit cards have been gendered in the second half of the 20th century – the idea that men earn the money and women spend it.

“The response to our work has really taken me by surprise,” says Nicky. “We thought there would be some resistance to using culture to talk about money, but actually people are very open to the idea that narratives and images allow us to access complex ideas and can give real meaning to the abstractions of finance.”
