Tier 2	Skilled Worker Route	1 January 2021	Anyone coming to the UK for work, EU or non-EU citizens, must score 70 points (from non-tradeable and tradeable criteria) to be eligible for this points- based sponsorship route. A streamlined, faster process with no overall cap on numbers and reduced skills and salary thresholds compared to Tier 2.
Tier 4: General	Student Route	5 October 2020	No limit to the number of international students permitted to enter the UK to study. A points-based system, a candidate must have an offer from an approved education institution, speak English and be able to support themselves during their studies to achieve the required points.
Tier 4: Doc Extn Scheme	Graduate Route	Summer 2021	 Allowing international students to stay in the UK to work or look for work after they graduate. Unsponsored route. Permitted stay: Two years for UG and Masters students Three years for PhD students Route does not count towards ILR.
Temporary Worker (Tier 5)	no change	Change planned for phase 2 'later in 2021'	Permitting individuals to be sponsored for short term, temporary employment to undertake supernumerary work including research, training or a government approved scheme. Duration of stay 12 to 24 months dependent upon purpose of visit.
	Highly Skilled Worker Route	No timeframe provided	In addition to the Global Talent route a broader unsponsored route is planned to run alongside the employer-led points-based system. Gov to explore in line with the MAC recommendations for such a route. No timeframe stated.
	Frontier Worker route	1 July 2021	 Permits workers to come to the UK to work while living elsewhere. Eligibility criteria restricts this route to: nationals of EU, Switzerland, Norway, Iceland or Liechtenstein; who live outside the UK; have worked in the UK by 31 December 2020 have kept working in the UK at least once every 12 months since starting work in the UK

Skilled Worker route costs vary according to:

- Applying from within or outside of UK
- SOC code of intended job
- duration of visa application
- nationality of candidate
