LifeLab: Summer School for prospective medics

We would like to invite all students currently in Year 9* and interested in finding out more about becoming a doctor to attend our Summer School.

You will spend a day at Southampton General Hospital where you will gain experience of what it is like to work as a doctor. You will have the chance to learn how to perform clinical skills, visit doctors working in different areas, and talk to medical students about training as a doctor.

The following day you will return to the University where you will work in a group to investigate the health of a simulated patient and use medical equipment to 'diagnose' their condition.

The two-day programme costs £95 per student.

Day 1: Southampton General Hospital

Talk to medical students about training as a doctor. Visit different areas of the hospital to watch doctors at work.

Day 2: University of Southampton

Become a doctor for the day. Work in a group to 'diagnose' your simulated patient using real medical equipment
