Educator



Multi-award winning New Orleans trumpeter, vocalist and composer, Abram Wilson, was one of the UK's most prominent contemporary jazz musicians, composers and educators.

In May this year, Abram was appointed as an inaugural Turner Sims Professor of Music, but sadly passed away in June. Many of students in the department had worked with him and he will be sadly missed.
