Accommodation

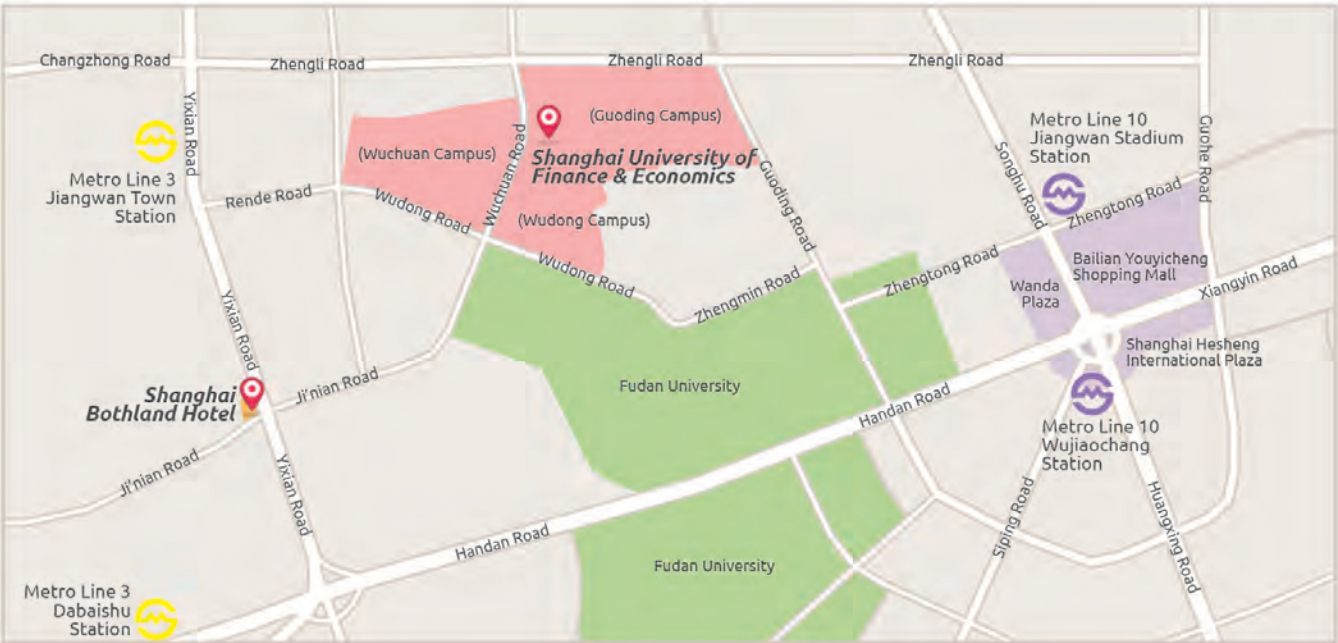

A range of twin rooms are offered for pairs of programme participants (each two shares a twin room), each room containing plenty of storage, internet access and a walk-in bathroom equipped with a shower, toilet and sink. 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Introduction to Shanghai

The character of SUFE is inseparable from its location. Situated in the heart of Yangpu District, Shanghai, the university is located in one of the most cosmopolitan cities in the world. Only a short distance from China's commercial center, SUFE stands at the crossroads of the economic growth of the nation, with an active involvement in business and trade affairs home and abroad.

Shanghai is a city of colors and consists of modern history and 21st century modernity, a melting pot of the world's cultures and nationalities. Since the British founded the first concession in 1842, Shanghai has grown and prospered to establish itself as the largest, most exciting port city in East Asia. For years men and women, nationwide and overseas, put energy and intellect in motion the gearing which converted the wartime colony into a new appreciation of the chief seat of commerce. There was plenty of

money, a sophisticated economic society, and a vibrant businesslike population of merchants and traders. The momentum gained by the growth of trade, the ability of Shanghai docks and the shipping to assimilate and distribute imports and exports, have given Shanghai the wealth that has laid a foundation for the financial capital of China.

In 2010 Shanghai hosted the World Expo, an event showcasing countries around the world and China's development. The World Expo is also a great event to explore the full potential of urban life, and that of cross-cultural communication of any possibilities in the future. Shanghai, honoured as the host, gained the success of international gathering of cultures and peoples, and has impressed the world with its forest of skyscrapers, unsurpassed entertainment, convenient traffic and most importantly, the increasing development of the eastern metropolis.

*Shanghai Weather

With a pleasant northern subtropical maritime monsoon climate, Shanghai enjoys four distinct seasons, generous sunshine and abundant rainfall. In July and August for ten days the highest temperature can reach 35 degrees centigrade or more. Generally you will need short-sleeved shirts in summer.

Telecom Providers

China Mobile, China Unicom and China Telecom are the three mobile operators in China providing mobile voice and broadband services through their nationwide mobile telecommunications network.

Many telecom outlets in the city look more like stalls. They sell mobile SIM cards, top-up vouchers and even rechargers for most phone models.

The mobile network is rather extensive and impressive in Shanghai. Signals can even be detected in the metro and in many elevators. If you are coming to China on a short term visit, one of priorities when you arrive would probably be to get a prepaid mobile SIM card.

You would save heaps and avoid those expensive international roaming charges when you make calls locally. Also, to buy a local SIM card will make it easier and a lot cheaper for your friends in China to contact you.

The prepaid cards are available at the official telcom shops such as China Mobile or at newsstands.

Finance Matters

Different banks offer different benefits and services to foreigners, so it is advisable to check your options before making a choice. It may also be useful to seek advice from your bank in your home country before coming to China.

Major banks in China provide English-speaking services, though service varies across banks and individual branches. Therefore, it's always advisable to take a Chinese friend along to the bank with you to help with any potential language difficulties. Besides, most banks offer online banking, where you can gain access to your account statements, transactions, and account balance.

Mostly, a current account provides a visa debit card, which can be used to make payment in shops and online as well as take money from ATMs up to a daily maximum limit, and is usually combined with an online banking service.

If you plan to open an account in China after arriving, please make sure that you have a valid passport and at least 40 RMB. Banks may ask for a deposit of 10-20 RMB or charge you a fee for the card. After you have filled out an application form, you will be asked to create your six digit PIN number.

How to use an ATM in China?

All Chinese ATMs have the option to choose "English" as the language in their menu, so don't think that your language skills will hinder you from getting money.

There are a couple things you need to ask yourself when finding the right Chinese ATM to use.

Which bank?

Typically you want to find a Bank of China or ICBC. These banks are reliably friendly to foreign cards and have locked spaces to get your money.

Which cards do they accept?

You'll usually see a sign in front of the ATM that tells whether it accepts Visa, MasterCard or any others. For the most part, if you have one of these credit providers, you'll be fine.

Do I use Credit or Debit?

The bank will accept both, but you'll save yourself a lot of extra fees if you use your debit card to withdraw money. Make sure you know your PIN number.

How much money do I need?

ATMs have a limit to how much money you can take out per day, usually capped at about 2500-3000RMB depending on the bank. If you need more than this, you'll need to go inside the bank or use multiple cards.

*Notes

When you withdraw money from a different bank's ATM, you will likely need to pay a handling charge. Please consult your bank for more details.

When you withdraw money from a Chinese ATM, your money will be given to you before your card is returned. Do not forget your ATM card.

Self-serve automated ticket booths are prevalent and would likely be the easiest mode of purchasing tickets and checking train schedules for those without an ability to utilize Chinese as the devices have an English mode. Tickets can also be conveniently booked in

Shanghai Metro

The Shanghai Metro is a rapid transit system in Shanghai China, operating urban and suburban rail transit services to 14 of its 17 municipal districts- rarely is there a place within metropolitan Shanghai you will find it not possible to reach, hadn't it been connected to the extensive Metro network.

Lines and services are denoted numerically as well as by characteristic colors, which are used as a visual aid for better distinction on station signages and on the exterior of trains, in the form of a colored block or belt.

Yu Garden is a Ming Dynasty garden built in 1559. There are many beautiful ancient buildings which have interesting names such as Iron Panther, Moon Tower and Hearing-Waves Pavilion. And it is not only a tourist attraction, but also a good shopping place where souvenir, local trinkets and famous snacks are sold.

Xin Tian Di Plaza

Shanghai Xintiandi Scene (xīn tiān dì, 新天地, pronounced Shin tea-en dee) is an ideal urban place for tourists to appreciate historical and cultural legacies of Shanghai as well as fashionable life in Shanghai. Technically, it is a pedestrian street which is composed of Shikumen (石库门, a unique classic Shanghai tenement in the middle of a 19th century) and modern architectures. With its historic lanes and new amenities- bars, cinemas, restaurants and high-end shops, it is one of the main tourist attractions in Shanghai. By the way, if you are looking to find a trace, a piece of the history of one of the most famous cities in the early 20th century, you should go there!

Xu Jia Hui

Xujiahui is a famous commercial center with myriad shops, office buildings, hotels and restaurants. The "Top Cathedral of the Far East", Xujiahui Cathedral, was built in 1910. The former site of the 1868 built Notre Dame Cathedral houses Shanghai Old Station Restaurant, where two train cars are on display – one was manufactured in Germany in 1899 while the other in Russia in 1919.

At night, the whole walkway is lit up.

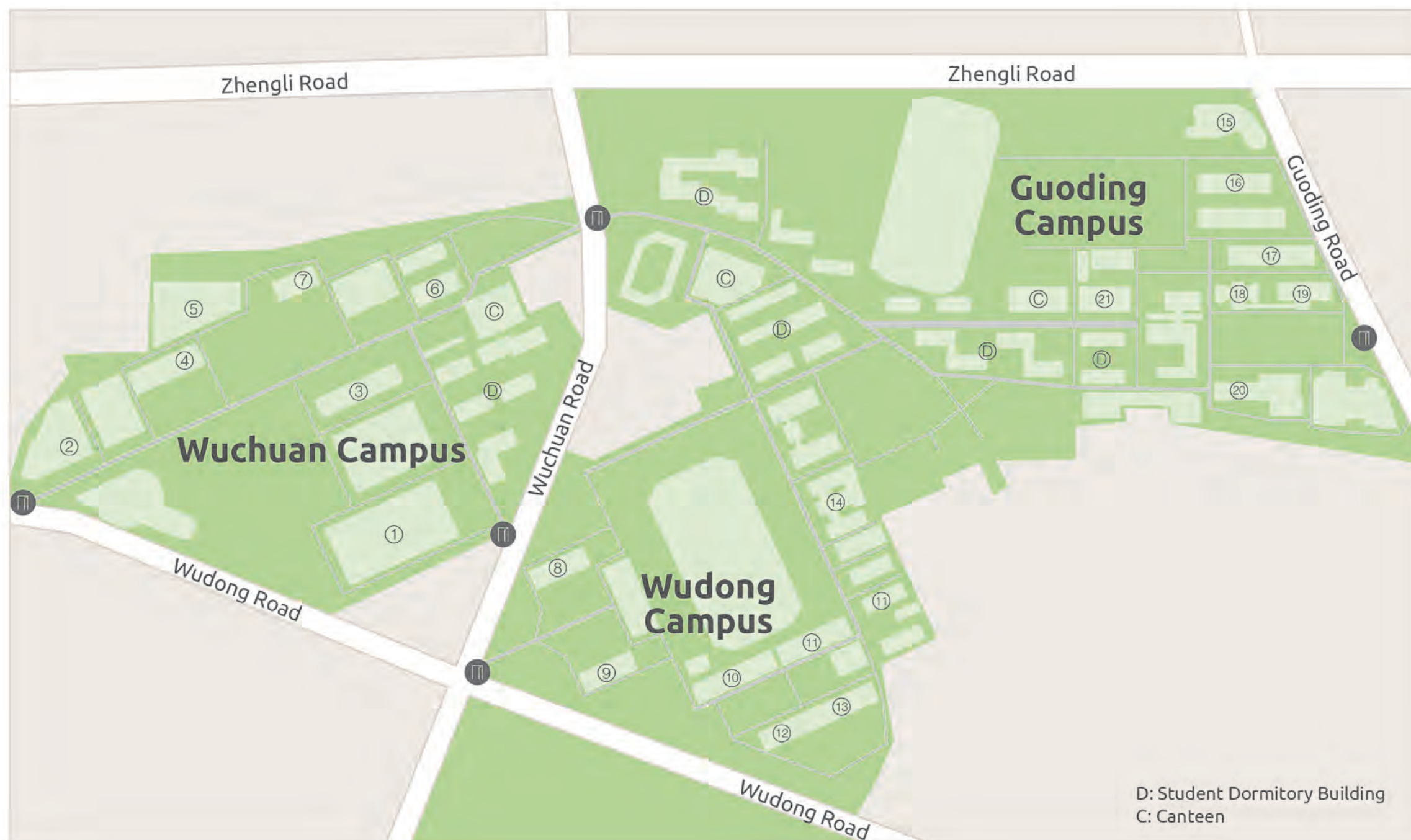

Our primary care clinic serves a community made up of students, staff and faculty body of the university, and of course short-term visitors within the wider SUFE community. If you are not part of these categories, please note that our Walk-in clinic is also open to all, including the local residents!

The Health Services is made up of a two-storey building to offer care in the areas of Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM), Specialty Medicine, Physiotherapy, Psychiatry, and other services. Physicians include family medicine and sports medicine physicians as well as specialists in Gynecology/Obstetrics, Psychiatry, Orthopaedics, Endocrinology, Internal Medicine, Pediatrics and Psychiatry. 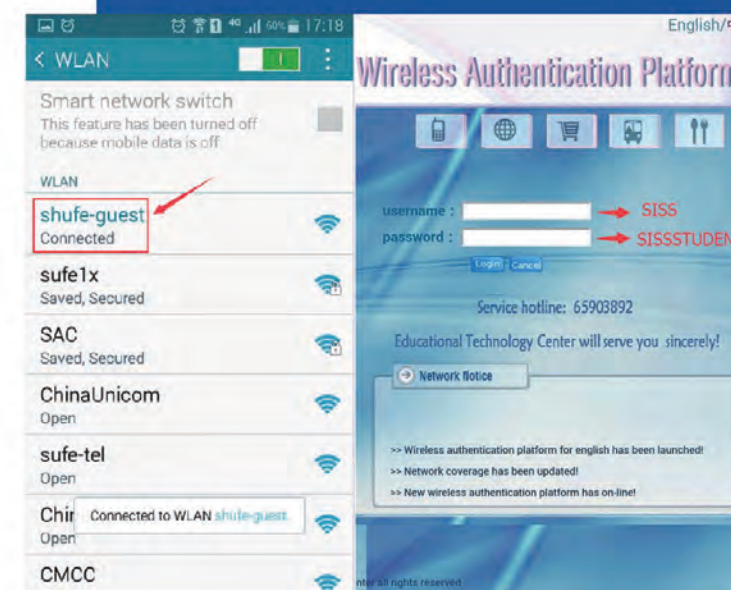

Modules of Study

The blocks of study offered extensively throughout the summer school are addressed in English and will focus on three topics : Chinese culture/language studies , Business Management Principles (and potentially may well be extended to free trade and the innovation of legal system) , and Real Estate Case Studies- each of them with an emphasis on an interdisciplinary approach to mapping key ideas in the Chinese Language along with social values and/or cultural expectations, which ideologically will serve the purpose of being a toolkit for understanding the Chinese market, as well as charting an exploration of its economy.

Assuming no prior knowledge of Chinese or the business-related subjects, layers of learning goals designated and set in each block are tailored to a beginner's progressive needs. Followed by a brief and intelligible introduction to terms and ideas, each week module will carefully balance theory and practice by offering audience with hands-on workshops and field trips, enabling participants to achieve a high degree of detailed and sophisticated study on real world business.

Unlike a business study setting out specific topics/data for students' own investigation, most of the questions/topics given in these modules are relatively general- no answers, solutions or model interpretations are offered identically from a business perspective, since there are numerous observations that participants can produce by linking to their research interest/ academic background. This means being a humanity student will not simply close his/her thinking off in this programme, but it will allow you to follow particular interests in more depth - or even more ideally to achieve a bundle of renewed knowledge and hands-on experience in humanity in a fairly short space of time.

Prerequisites are not expected for securing a place of attendance, as modules designed within are fundamentally an ideal option for international students having rare knowledge about China yet are passionate for getting exposed to its local community.

Course syllabuses/Lecture notes/Handouts will be available from the lecturer or teaching assistant upon request prior to each class.



Buddies

The Buddies Programme designated for SISS is a three-week commitment during which you are paired with a local student volunteering to accompany and support you in every single circumstance, while you join SISS fundamentally as a step-stone to attaining a renewed perspective of Chinese cultures, business, societies and languages.

Features of the programme include:

- Pairing based on your major, interests, and personality
- Pick-ups from the airport to the accommodation site
- Regular meet-ups (presumably each afternoon after class) with your buddy for meals, coffee, studying, shopping, movies, and a range of social events including campus

walk, karaoke, river cruise, weekend trips etc.

- A welcome reception for all buddies upon start of the summer school (rescheduled to 26th June), and the closing ceremony wrapping up the summer on a high note with an unforgettable experience of new friendships.

- A free buddy T-shirt

Once advised you are paired with a local student as your buddy. Don't be surprised in case you are contacted individually from your buddy- for your tailored needs on a range of pre-arrival practicalities, as this will help you settle quickly upon arrivals and lay foundations for new friendships.



Arrivals & Pick-up Services

You are expected to arrive on the requested date (as specified in your offer letter) and proceed to the accommodation site.

Please note: whichever airlines you choose to start your journey, you should land on Pudong or Hongqiao Airport for the destination of Shanghai. Upon arrival you should arrange the connecting transport on your own to proceed to the accommodation site RATHER THAN TO THE UNIVERSITY.

Alternatively – for pick-up services, you may also expect to meet your buddies comprised of local students at the airport, who'd be happy to escort you along the onward journey to the residential site subject to prior request through email (as will be communicated via future email with your buddy).

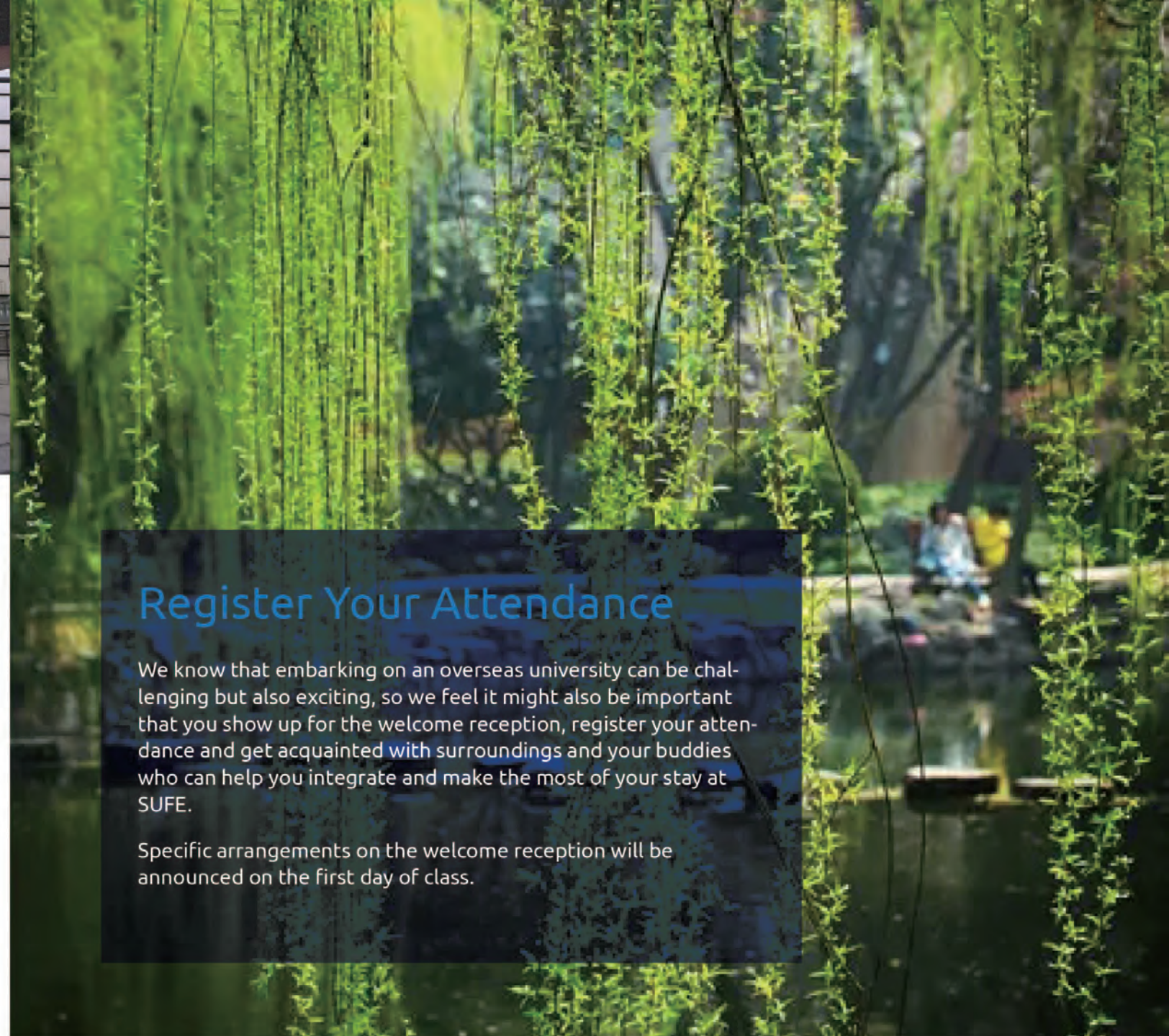
- for Pudong Airport Arrivals
