



 - Closed June 12th 2018

Future Leaders Fellowships

- Scheme launched April 3rd 2018
- It is mandatory for this call that host organisations submit an Expression of Interest (EOI) for each of the applicants they intend to put forward; deadline for RO submission of EOI's to round 2 is 4/10/2018
- Full applications for the second round must be submitted via the Joint Electronic Submission system Je-S by 16:00 BST, 31st October 2018.


How are Future Leaders Fellowships different?

- Open across entire UKRI remit, no barriers to interdisciplinarity
- Open to individuals <u>based in business</u> or Universities, and working with other research and use environments
- Provide long term funding (4-7 years) to tackle adventurous programmes or multidisciplinary questions
- Academic employer commitment: tapered salary support and up-front follow-on position.

What is MRC looking for in an application? Research Excellence and Deliverability

Your application will only be as strong as its weakest link



Deliverability – get the balance right




- Deliverability relates to project plan, project team, risk mitigation strategies etc
- Decisions to get to your desired outcome
- Graphically represent your plan: schematic flowcharts that capture relevant contingencies, decision points, and interdependencies
- Don't double up risks
- Don't be overly ambitious in your timelines
- Include the right expertise; clinical, statistical etc.
- Show that you have access to the right facilities

MRC Board and Panel Scoring Matrix

Score	Score Indicators – Quality, Impact, Productivity
10	Exceptional – Top international programme or of exceptional national strategic importance
9	Excellent- Internationally competitive and leading edge (innovative) in most areas
8	Very High Quality – Internationally competitive and leading edge nationally
7	High Quality – Leading edge nationally and internationally competitive in parts
6	High Quality – Leading edge nationally, but not yet internationally competitive
