

Chinese and English Maritime Law Conference

With China's pre-eminent position in global trade, its laws will shape the future of the shipping industry and modern trade. The historical and modern importance of English maritime law means that it has been a strong influence on China's law. From its English as well as international roots, the maritime law of China is developing in modern times into a distinctly Chinese framework with the capacity to influence world trade. This conference brings English and Chinese maritime law together under the same microscope to discover and discuss similarities, differences and trends.

The conference takes place over three days, starting with a full day at the University of Southampton and continuing with an afternoon at the offices of Norton Rose Fulbright. The conference finishes at China Maritime Centre, University of Greenwich. The three days have different programmes and speakers, and are booked separately. The event is organised by the Institute of Maritime Law at the University of Southampton, with a generous grant from the Confucius Institute at the University of Southampton. Our partners are the China Maritime Centre at the University of Greenwich and the law firm Norton Rose Fulbright. The conference is also supported by Maritime London.
