

## MSc Clinical Leadership in Cancer, Palliative and End of Life Care

Level 7 Masters

Duration: One to two years full time; two to four years part time

#### Target audience

Clinical leaders and emerging clinical leaders from any health care discipline, caring for people of any age (children, teenagers, young people or adults) with cancer or with palliative or end of life care needs (as a consequence of any illness).

#### Content

This innovative inter-professional programme is designed to progressively enhance your ability to provide expert care, lead and transform clinical services, develop others and contribute to clinical research in the specialties of cancer, palliative and end of life care. The programme will be individually tailored to your learning needs and provided by a faculty with internationally recognised clinical, educational and research expertise. Workshops and master-classes provided in small (2 day) blocks of attendance, will be interspersed with tailored work-based learning and e-learning. In addition students will be supported by both a discipline specific academic tutor and a research coach.

#### **Programme structure**

There are 3 core specialty modules:

- Specialist Practice in Cancer,
  Palliative and End of Life Care
- Policy and Service Design in Cancer,
  Palliative and End of Life Care
- International and Contemporary Perspectives of Clinical Leadership in Cancer, Palliative and End of Life Care
- e-learning for Generic Research Methods
- One module selected from the choice available across the University, appropriate to the student's practice
- Dissertation module

#### **Programme awards**

For a post-graduate certificate students will need to complete all of the core specialty modules

For a Post Graduate Diploma students will need to complete all of the core modules, the e-learning module and one module of their choice

For a MSc students will need to complete the requirements for a PG Diploma and the dissertation.

#### **Entry requirements**

The normal entry requirements are:

- A first degree (2:2 or above) or equivalent, in a relevant subject from an approved institution of higher education
- Current professional registration with relevant professional/ statutory body or equivalent
- Experience providing care to adults or young people or children with cancer, or that have palliative care or end of life care needs as a consequence of any illness
- A satisfactory reference and evidence of support from their manager.
