

# Southampton Statutory & Mandatory Skills - Education Framework

## Introduction

The faculty require all pre-registration students to undertake basic statutory & mandatory skills training as detailed in the UK Core Skills Training Framework 1.3 (Skills for Health 2016) prior to undertaking any practice placements. This training will be completed as part of the Introduction to Professional Practice (IPP) Module that is undertaken by all pre-registration students in multi-professional groups.

### Initial training

Consists of three practical workshops and the completion of 16 on-line training packages.

### Practical Workshops:

Infection Control (1 hour) Basic Life support (2 hours) Moving and Handling (3 hours)

## On-line packages:

Adult Basic life Support with Pocket mask Adult Basic Life Support with Bag-Valve-Mask Adult resuscitation - out of Hospital Automated External Defibrillator (AED) Child and Infant BLS Communications with Angry patients through De-escalation Consent, Capacity and Competency issues Fire Safety Hand Washing Health, Safety and welfare Information Governance Moving and Handling 1 Normal Movement Moving and Handling 2 Legislation Moving and Handling 3 Risk Assessment Use of Apron and Gloves Safeguarding (Preventing radicalisation training to be completed as a mandatory skill later in year 1)

#### **Recording training**

Attendance at the three practical workshops is recorded. Completion of the on-line training packages is recorded electronically. All students are required to complete all components. Once all requirements are completed this information is forwarded to the Placement Team who will, on confirmation that the student additionally has Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) and Occupational Health clearance, declare them ready for placement.

#### **Update training**

This will be undertaken as dictated by UK Core Skills Training Framework and provided within profession specific modules.
