Exemptions

The clause(s) listed below describe where an exemption from the General Regulations for Progression, Determination and Classification of Results for Undergraduate and Integrated Masters Programmes exists:

Section 5, Clause 5.3 Internal Repeat: It is not possible to repeat the compulsory year abroad. However, the assessment may be re-submitted as a referral and/or re-submitted as an external repeat only.

Variations

The clause(s) listed below describe where a variation from the General Regulations for Progression, Determination and Classification of Results for Undergraduate and Integrated Masters Programmes exists.

Existing University Regulation		Approved Variation
9.2	Weighting of Parts: Part I work shall be excluded from the final degree classification. A weighting of 0:1:2 shall be used to obtain the Final Average Mark for the three Parts of an Honours degree programme, and a weighting of 0:1:2:2 for the four Parts of an integrated Masters programme. This is in addition to weighting by credit points (for example, where Parts III and IV do not contain the same number of credit points). http://www.calendar.soton.ac.uk/sectionIV/progression-regs.html	Weighting of Parts: Part I work shall be excluded from the final degree classification. A weighting of 0:1:2:2 shall be used to obtain the Final Average Mark for the four Parts of an Honours degree programme that includes a compulsory year abroad which is being assessed via the core module LANG3005. LANG3005 will be used to determine progression to Part IV
