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# As a result of what students have said, Southampton have made changes:

**Examples include:** 

Enhanced Wi-Fi services in the Hartley Library

Student Services launched the Aspire Awards which has enabled students to have access to up to £20,000 to help fund projects outside of their academic course.

The Students' Union
launched their very first
Women in Sport Week, led
by the Sports Participation
Officer, to raise awareness
of successful female athletes
at the University.

A new work-shadowing scheme will soon be trailed, where students will have the opportunity to work closely with staff.

MyCareer now reminds all students about upcoming sessions they have booked by email 24 hours in advance, as well as on the day.
