If an area is designated as an 'area of intervention' locally or regionally there may be a need to restrict University services and activities in a phased manner so that face to face teaching provision is retained as long as it is safe to do so.

These 'tiers of restriction' identified by <u>government guidance</u> will be implemented in such cases after consideration by UEB.

Students will be kept informed as and when these tiers are likely to change.
