
UoS Career Hub

Ask the Adviser appointments provide the opportunity to have a short conversation with an adviser about anything careers related. Our advisers can refer you to resources, events and individual help sessions where required.

CV Support Appointments

Our dedicated CV Support appointments offer a 15-minute personalised 1:1 advice session on creating a standout CV.

Guidance Appointments

Our Careers Consultants provide individual guidance, on referral from Ask the Adviser. During a 45-minute appointment we can help you to consider your short and long-term career plans, focus your applications, prepare for interviews or perfect your job search strategies. We can also help you explore your options if you are thinking of leaving your course or the University.

SUCCESSFUL FUTURES PATHWAY

New for autumn 2024, our Successful Futures Pathway is available to access on MyCareer.

The pathway aligns with the Southampton Skills Model, which outlines 14 skills identified by our employers, industry partners, and broader research insights as being sought after and valued by graduate recruiters.

Research shows that students who are more self-aware and clearer on their career strengths feel more confident in their ability to succeed in the future. We aim to support you to reflect and understand the skills you are developing during your studies and identify clear examples and evidence to use in applications.

Through the Successful Futures Pathway, you will be able to reflect on your career ideas and plan how you are going to develop the skills aligned to your career aspirations, both within and outside your studies, whilst at university.

The pathway will:

- → Allow you to reflect on your career ideas and access support and guidance on different stages of career planning
- → Provide a Skills Self-Assessment to help you assess how experienced and confident you are in the 14 employability skills from the Southampton Skills Model
- → Explore the new AI ChatBot to review how your skills and experience align with your chosen career path
- → Identify the skills that have already been mapped to your course to enable you to identify gaps and areas for development
- → Find opportunities outside of your course to further develop or start to develop your chosen skills and plan your next steps


Giving students the skills, support and funding to start their own businesses

From dedicated 1:1 appointments to inspiring workshops and funding opportunities, we can connect you to the relevant networks and support you to take your idea to the next level.

If you are already running a business or want to explore your business idea further, our flagship Foundership Scheme could be the ideal support programme for you. Running over the summer months, the Foundership Scheme provides funding, co-working space and interactive learning sessions on topics such as sales and marketing, branding and tone of voice, intellectual property and legal, accounting, networking and raising investment – all with input from our network of experts.

This will provide you with a portfolio of transferable skills and potentially inspire your future career direction. We will give you the support you need to secure work experience, from providing advice on how to source a job to guidance on the application and selection process.

STUDENT INNOVATION PROJECTS

A Student Innovation Project is designed to offer you the opportunity to gain invaluable experience of working on real-life business issues put forward by local businesses and not-for-profit organisations. You will work in a team of four to five students from across a range of faculties and year groups, to develop innovative solutions to a business problem.

Student Innovation Projects last for four weeks and can be completed alongside your studies. The projects are open to students from any degree discipline and no business experience is required to take part.

How will a Student Innovation Project benefit you?

- \rightarrow The training provided will help you to successfully complete the project
- \rightarrow It will provide you with the opportunity to work with a local business or not-for-profit organisation on a real business issue
- → It will give you the opportunity to work in a team with peers from faculties that you may not normally engage with

INNOVATION CHALLENGE

The Innovation Challenge is an intensive, four-day project where you will work in a team of three to five students to solve a business challenge provided by top employers. Working together you will develop your research, communication and presentation skills, providing creative solutions to a business problem.

The Innovation Challenge is open to students from any degree discipline and takes place during the Easter and Summer vacations, giving you a chance of winning a great prize!

How will the Innovation Challenge benefit you?

- ightarrow A chance to build a portfolio of skills over a short space of time
- \rightarrow The opportunity to work closely with top graduate employers on a real business issue
- → The most successful team will have the chance to win a fantastic prize at the end of the challenge

UoS Internships offer paid, University-approved opportunities to help you gain invaluable work experience and boost your employability.

Each year, hundreds of full-time and part-time flexible internship opportunities are available exclusively to University of Southampton students. All internships are project-based and carefully selected to ensure that you have a valuable, inspiring and exciting experience.

YEAR IN EMPLOYMENT PLACEMENTS

Year in Employment Placements offer many undergraduate students the opportunity to complete a placement year as part of their degree. The placement can be aligned to your course subject or in a completely unrelated area of interest. Through developing your professional and employability skills and gaining valuable experience, a Year in Employment Placement will help put you in a strong position for securing a graduate career.

The Work Experience Team can help with sourcing a placement and are on hand to support you throughout your year. You could travel abroad or stay closer to home or university, depending on where your chosen role is based.

Students on most undergraduate courses without a placement or study abroad opportunity can participate in a Year in Employment Placement.

How could a Year in Employment Placement benefit you?

- → The opportunity to work in a chosen field of interest and find out if it's right for you
- → Most placements are paid with average salaries between £18,000 and £23,000
- → Successful students will have 'Year in Employment' added to their degree transcripts



VOLUNTEERING BANK

The Volunteering Bank has a range of openings for students and graduates, from one-off opportunities, such as music events at local venues, to on-going commitments with local or national organisations, including Tudor House Museum and Oxfam. Some organisations also offer opportunities to volunteer remotely, either online or via telephone.

Volunteering can give you the opportunity to:

- ightarrow Boost your CV with additional work experience
- → Develop existing skills or learn new ones, such as teamwork, time management, problem solving or commercial awareness
- → Explore different sectors and job roles
- → Support your local community and meet new people
- Employers recognise the value of volunteering and the additional experience it can provide, so consider whether this is something which would not only be of benefit to others, but might also benefit your career prospects.

PART-TIME WORK AND UOS JOB SHOP

Are you the first person in your family, other than siblings, to go to university? If so, you are a 'First Generation' student.
