City centre

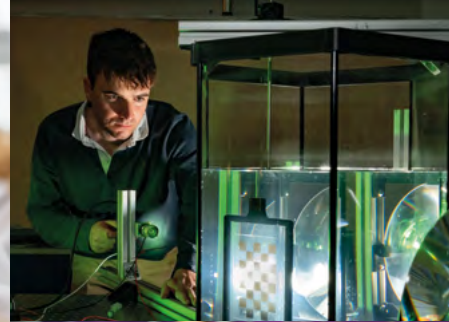
Explore Southampton city centre

While you're here, step beyond campus and explore the city that could become home.

- Stop to eat and drink in favourite student areas like Above Bar Street, Bedford Place and Westquay
- Visit free exhibitions at John Hansard Gallery and Southampton City Art Gallery, next to our City Centre campus
- Stay to enjoy the city's vibrant and varied night scene. From discovering new local musicians, to playing virtual darts, you'll find entertainment to match your mood
- Step back in time wandering through the Old Town and learn about the city's powerful connection to the Titanic at the SeaCity Museum
- Take time out in green spaces including Palmerston Park, close to City centre campus, and Southampton Common, next to Avenue Campus
- Shop and unwind at Westquay shopping centre

Many Unilink buses pass through the city centre, so it's easy to make an extra stop.

Investing in *the future*

A number of new developments and reinvented spaces on campus will provide our students, colleagues and the local community with inspiring places to grow, learn, work and visit:

North East Quadrant

Designed to be our most sustainable building, this will be a place to learn, study, socialise and relax. You'll find lecture theatres, seminar rooms, study areas, wellbeing facilities, a café, and indoor and outdoor social spaces. It is set among plenty of green space, including outdoor covered study spaces and areas to unwind.

Nuffield Theatre

A new fully accessible teaching, learning, and theatre space. This £19m refurbishment will provide a new future for this iconic building while continuing to be a space for new talent, ideas and creative performance.

STEM building

A new £180m building that will act as a hub for collaborative teaching of Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths. It will provide collaborative laboratories, wetrooms, computer rooms and our largest 420-seat lecture theatre, along with breakout spaces to share ideas and socialise.

Once you’ve finished your visit, use your confirmation email to travel for free on any Unilink bus or Open Day shuttle buses and explore the city you could call home.

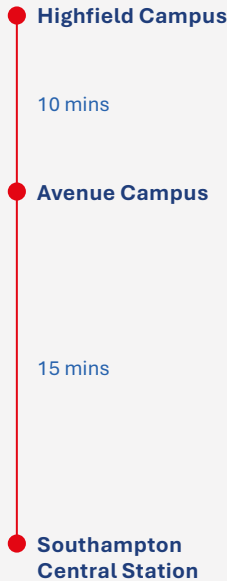
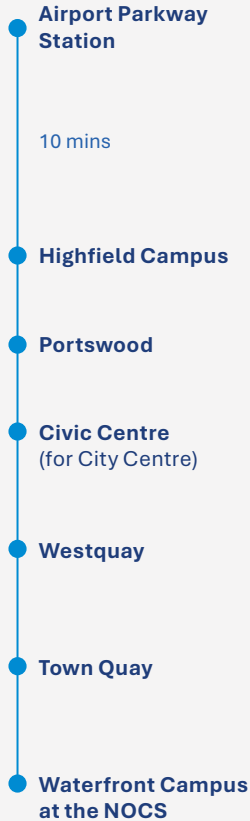

Avenue Campus

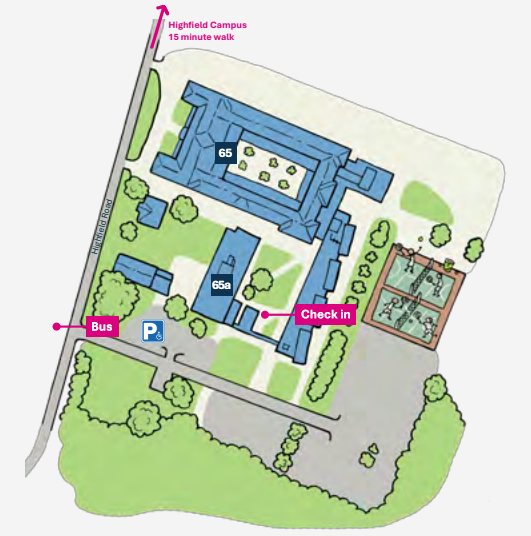
Home to our humanities community and a purpose built archaeology facility, Avenue Campus sits alongside Southampton Common, just a short walk from Highfield.

Head towards Building 46. Follow the stairs and turn left to follow the path down Lovers Walk. Cross at the pedestrian crossing on Highfield Lane, continue along Highfield Road. Avenue Campus will be on your left. A number of signposts will be in position to help you on your journey.

For step-free access, pass Building 46, turn left onto Chamberlain Road and follow the signposts to Avenue Campus. Both walking and step free routes are signposted, with ambassadors on hand to help.

Unilink buses stop on The Avenue (A33).

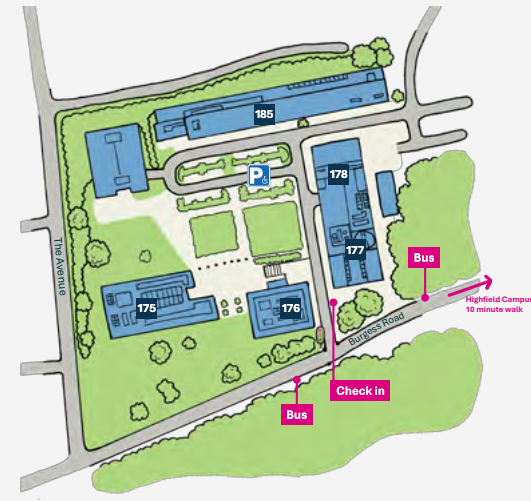


Boldrewood Innovation Campus

A short walk from Highfield, Boldrewood is home to engineering and the University of Southampton Business School.

How to get there:

Walk towards Building 60 down University Road. Turn left and follow Burgess Road (A35). Use the pedestrian crossing at the junction with Glen Eyre Road and the garage and continue eastbound along Burgess Road. Boldrewood Innovation Campus will be on your right. The route will be signposted.



Waterfront Campus at the National Oceanography Centre Southampton (NOCS)

Set within Southampton's docks, our Waterfront Campus at the NOCS is home to our ocean and Earth sciences community, and includes an aquarium, laboratories, library, and more.

How to get there:
