WHAT IS AUDIOLOGY?

Audiology is about identifying and assessing hearing and balance function and their associated disorders

11 million people in the UK have some form of hearing loss

$\frac{1}{3}$ of 60 yr olds
 $\frac{2}{3}$ of 70 yr olds

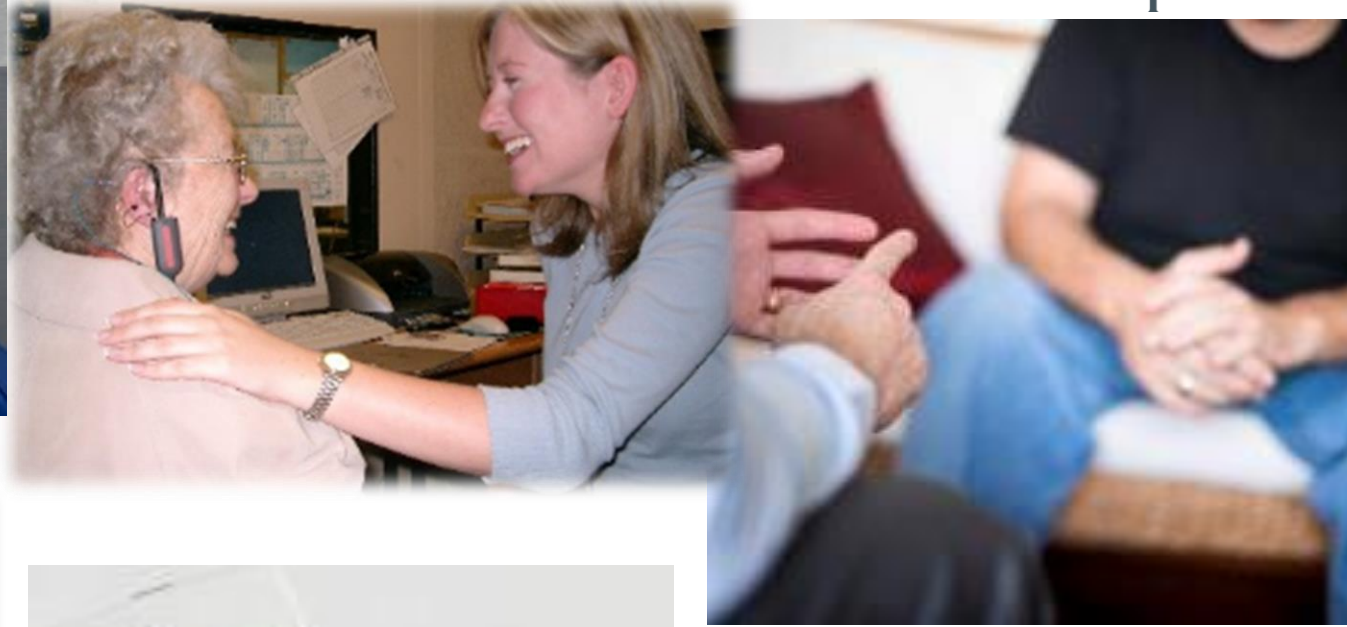
On average it takes people ten years to address their hearing loss

By 2035 estimated that 1 in 5 people in the UK will have a hearing loss (15.6 million people)

Hearing loss is a modifiable risk factor for dementia

Can lead to loss of confidence, isolation, unemployment, depression, breakdown in relationships...







The small titanium implant

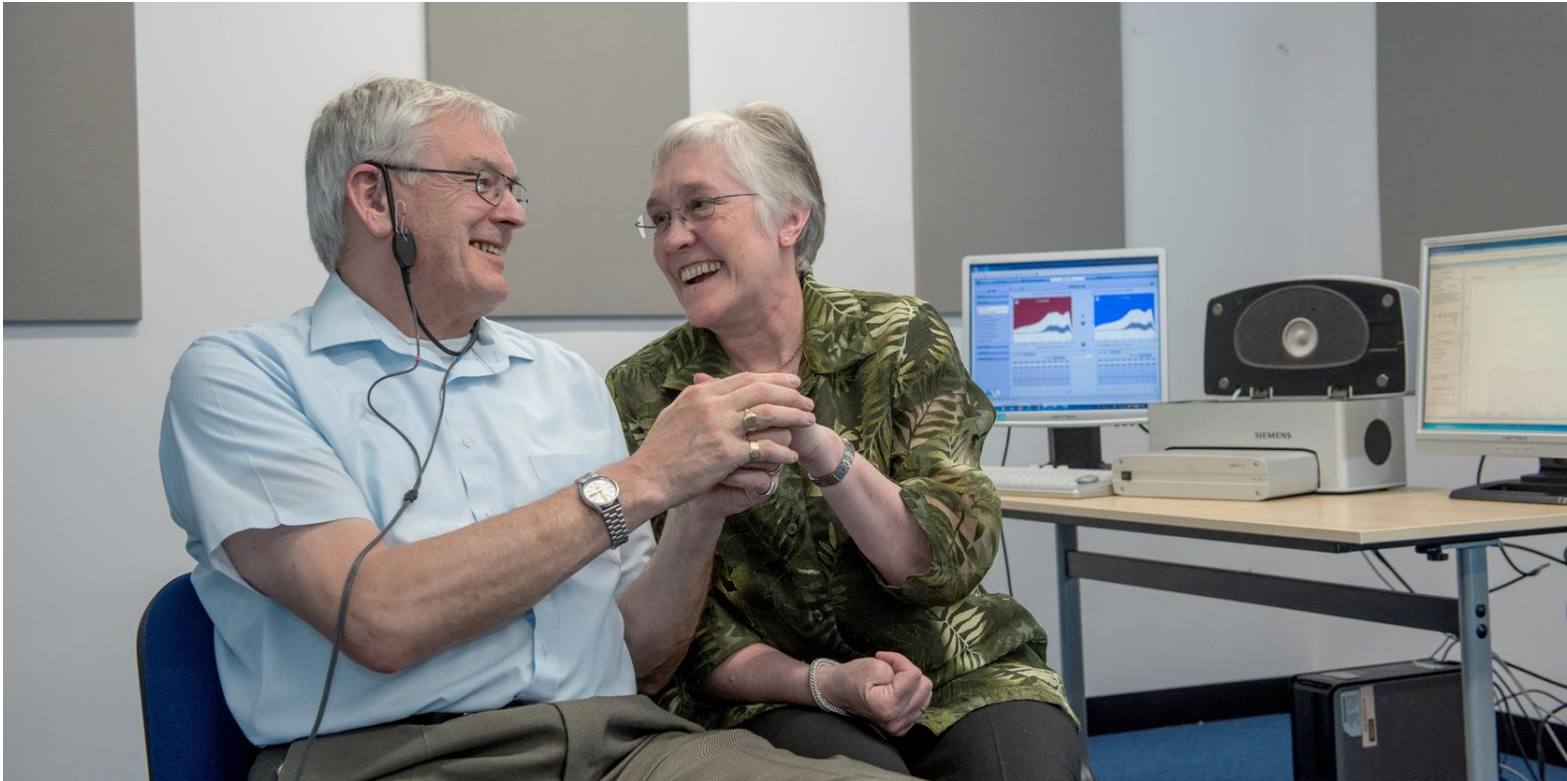


The abutment without sound processor

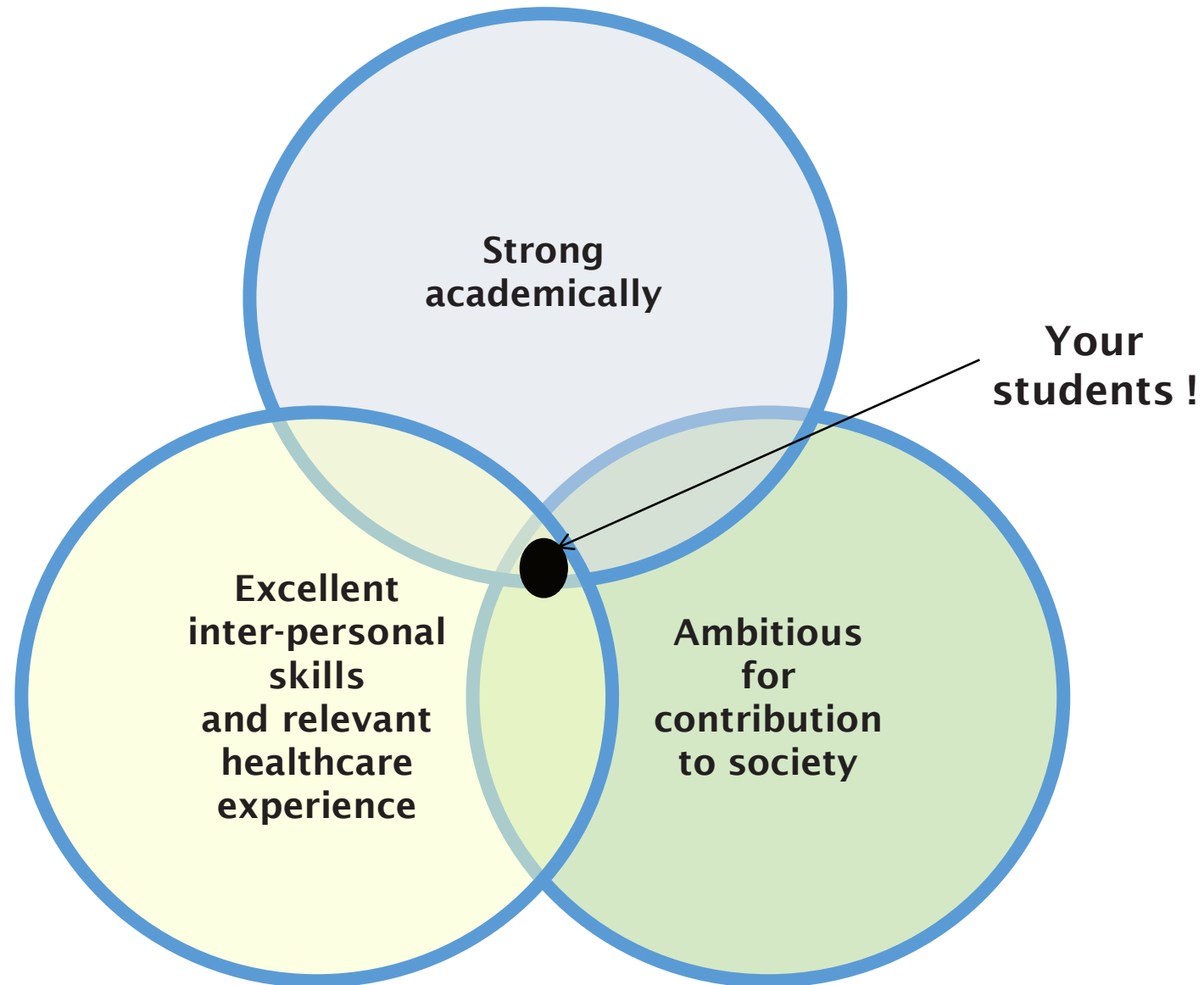
